Funding for short courses and research – apply now!


TROPHI education bursaries (\$1000) Bursaries to support Primary Health Care team members to access education aligned with TROPHI regional needs, or aimed at building capacity for involvement in research, translation or education.

TROPHI research development bursaries (\$5000) Bursaries for junior GP registrars and trainees from other primary care disciplines to support training or research involvement. This funding could cover the costs of professional development aimed at building capacity for involvement in research, translation or education, or it could go towards the costs associated with an appropriately supervised research activity.
